Obama Inn Fire Displaces Female Sex Workers (FSWs) Bor, Jonglei State –14th March 2024

A fire broke out at 11:20 PM late last night at the Obama Inn, located in Bor Town.

Thankfully, there have been no reports of injuries or deaths associated with the incident. However, the fire has displaced 6 Female Sex Workers (FSWs) who have lost their belongings including shelter, clothes, and other personal effects. The FSWs require urgent humanitarian

support as their livelihood is disrupted and shelters are

destroyed with shelter materials, clothes, WASH items, and food as they go through this situation.

The cause of the fire is currently under investigation. The Obama Inn management is working closely with local authorities to determine the blaze's origin.

"Our top priority is the well-being of our peers [female sex workers] who were affected by this fire," said Dr. Garang Awuoldit, Key Population Project Officer at Bor Site for Yo' Care South Sudan.

"We are committed to supporting the displaced female sex workers during this difficult time. The livelihood of the FSWs is anchored on their sex work which is done mainly at their

congregation joints such as the Obama Inn. The FSWs are an important key population

in societies and are most vulnerable. The displacements add to the existing dire

economic situation for these groups. We are working to provide them with temporary

accommodations, essential items, and emotional support," he continued.

The Inn's activities on 14th March 2024 will be focused on assisting displaced female sex

workers.
